





SUMMER **GLAM** LOOK



Gone are the days of cakey makeup. Now it the era of minimalistic makeup. So say goodbye to heavy foundation and concealer and hello to skin care products that make your skin glow naturally.

Here's a simple, step by step tutorial for a summer glam look:

1. Cleanse + Exfoliate

Cleansing is an absolute must! It washes off all the dirt and grime from your face. Exfoliating removes dead skin cells. This step also helps in the proper blending of foundation later on.

2. Sunscreen

Sunscreen keeps the skin protected from the sun. It helps avoid sunspots and premature aging of the skin.

3. Primer

Primer smoothens the skin and makes it even to work on. For those who aren't comfortable with primer, moisturizer can be a good substitute.

4. Foundation

Foundation is applied to the whole face and neck. It is first blended along the jawline with a brush or sponge, and then the rest of the face and neck. To avoid a cakey look proper blending of foundation is important.

5. Concealer

Concealer is used to cover dark hide blemishes. circles. highlight and correct your skin. A lighter concealer is applied from the tear duct to the temples to highlight the area and a darker concealer is used around blemishes to cover them.

6. Contour

If you are using powder contour, set your face before using contouring, but if you are using liquid contour then setting is not required beforehand. Apply the contour around the jawline (from the tip of the ear to the end of cheek) and forehead. Blend the contour upwards to create proper illusions.

7. Powder

Apply powder from under the eyes to the temples and blend well to avoid any chalky areas. Apply it all over the face to set the makeup.

8. Bronzer

Apply bronzer on the nose, cheeks, and forehead. Rub a little over the contour to give a blended, brownish, sun kissed look.

9. Blush

Blush is a must have product for a glam look. Apply it over the bronzer on the cheeks and sweep it upwards towards the temples along the cheekbones for rosy cheeks.

10. Eyebrows

Draw upward strokes with an eyebrow pencil to get thin and hairlike lines. It is to be applied only wherever necessary to make your brows look natural. A spoolie is used to soften and get rid of obvious pencil marks.

11. Eyeshadow

Eyeshadow can be completely personalised. It can be any shade you're in the mood for. A highlighter can be used as an alternative.

12. Eyeliner and Mascara

Like eye shadow, your eyeliner can also be personalised as well. A simple sweep of the brush or a cat eye, it's up to you! Once that is done curl your eyelashes and apply mascara on them.

13. Highlighter

Highlighter is applied along the cheekbones, on the nose tip, under the brows and on the cupid's bow. The highlighter on the cheekbones is blended up towards the temples.

14. Lipstick

Apply lipstick or tinted lip balm in a matches that eyeshadow. The right lip colour is crucial for a perfect look!

15. Setting spray

Finish off your look with some setting spray. This helps in settling the lovely makeup you've just applied and also keeps the skin fresh and hydrate

EXPRESSIONISM

"No longer shall I paint the interiors with men reading and women knitting. I will paint living people who breathe and feel and suffer and love." -Edvard Munch.

Expressionism is the act of expressing oneself through some means. While the name might seem simple, it has a long history behind it. It is an epic modernist movement with an even greater legacy that follows it!

The roots of expressionism belong to the years before World War-I. Isn't it fascinating that something which appears so modern came to be so long ago?





ORIGIN AND HISTORY

The birth of the term 'expressionism' dates back to the 1850s. It refers to "artistic style in which the artist seeks to depict not objective reality, but rather the subjective emotions and responses that objects and events that arouses within a person." The origin of the art style can be traced back to 1901 in Paris, to paintings exhibited by the obscure artist Julien-Auguste Herve, which he named 'Expressionisms.'

The movement's sole purpose was to introduce the panorama of subjective emotions via art. It could be called an avantgarde way of expressing art.

During 1855-1900, artists like Vincent Van Gogh, Edvard Munch, and James Ensor developed a personal style in their paintings and became icons of the expressionism art movement. These artists used their expressive abilities, using elements of colours, shapes, lines, and various other forms, to bring emotions to paintings.






FOUNDATION



Expressionism had a few fundamental and foundational movements during its era that contributed to revolutionary art to the movement. In 1905 a group of four German students guided by Ernest Ludwig Kirchner founded a group called Die Brucke (The Bridge) in the city of Dresden. A few years later, in 1911, a group of young artists formed another group called Der Blaue Reiter (The Blue Rider) in Munich. Kandinsky and Franz Marc were its founders, with Paul Klee and August Macke amongst its members.





I feel comfortable 'wearing my emotions ', now and for always.




What ensued was a trend with people buying or making this supper cute dreamland dress that we're all still enamoured by.


BRIDGING THE MUSIC
